The Clans on the Coast Celtic Festival was envisioned by Ron Swan who has a strong passion for Scottish culture and is proud of his heritage. Wherever Ron goes he spreads the Scottish heritage message about which he is so passionate. He devotes his life to opening th community's eyes to their Scottish backgrounds and has helped many people recognise their Scottish heritage, awakening a passion for their Celtic heritage in the hearts of many people in the Port Stephens area. Ron's vision was to create an annual festival celebrating and sharing the cultural contribution of the Scottish and Celtic settlers to Australia. These contributions have much historical significance.

Clans on the Coast – a Not for Profit group run by volunteers who donate to Palliative care, Cancer care and more. Year of Scotland in Australia 2020

The Year of Scotland in Australia, 2020 is a nationwide calendar of activity celebrating Scottish music, culture, food and drink. Activities include more than 35 Australian festivals, some of Scotland's finest artists taking part in regional and remote Australian touring, and on the YOSA website notices of Burns Night Suppers, St Andrew's Day events, Highland Games and Clan Gatherings, Hogmanay.

According to the 2016 Census 119,416 Australian residents were born in Scotland while 2,023,474 claimed Scottish ancestry. It is hoped that YOSA 2020 "will give those with Scottish heritage a taste of home while satisfying renewed interest in Scottish culture generated by productions such as *Outlander* and *Mary, Queen of Scots*" See the YOSA website for notices of up and coming events -

Scholarships

The Hunter Valley Scots Club Inc has as its primary aim, the promotion of all forms of Scottish Culture

It will from time to time, offer financial assistance to persons wishing to undertake studies in or, to participate in events of a Scottish Cultural nature.

Conditions attached to these grants are:

- Grants may be awarded to applicants resident in the Hunter Region of NSW who wish to advance their knowledge and skills in their chosen field eg Highland Dancing, Country Dancing, Piping, Drumming, Music, other
- 2. Grants made by the Club are intended to augment the applicant's own resources
- 3. Grants may be awarded for studies and events locally, interstate or overseas
- 4. Although no age limit is set, preference will be given to applicants in the younger age bracket who fulfil the other conditions
- 5. Applicants must provide information on the course of study or event in which they propose to participate
- 6. The grantee must provide Hunter Valley Scots Club with regular reports during the period of the grant where this exceeds one month
- 7. The grantee must undertake to pass on the advanced knowledge gained to others in the same sphere of interest over a period of six months after the completion of the course
- 8. Applications for a grant must be submitted on the appropriate form and arrangements made for two Referees to send reports directly to the above address
- 9. Announcements of the award of grants will be made within a month of the closing date
- 10. Closing date for Applications and Statements from Referees 30 April 2020
