I have enjoyed my tenure as President and thanks to an enthusiastic and efficient Management Committee I believe we have been successful in contributing to the promotion of Scottish Culture in our region.

Since the AGM last year in September when the Committee was elected and we socialised over a BBQ, we have held two major functions, Burns Night and Caledonian Night, four social evenings, a Church Parade for St Andrew's Day, a Soup and Damper lunch, supported the local ANZAC Day ceremony, and a few of us have visited a number of other cultural festivals. We have represented the Hunter Valley Scots Club at Naturalisation Ceremonies and more.

Social Nights

Our Christmas Social Night was most successful with entertainment by some of the Hirers of Teralba Hall – Bill's Ballroom, the Boolaroo Orchid Society, Dancers of Universal Peace, Scotia Highland Dancing Association, Royal Scottish Country Dancers, Lake Macquarie U3A, Lakeside Folk Circle and Hunter Bush Dancers. Other Social Nights over the past year have included the Maitland Pipe Band and the Mineworkers Pipe Band both of which also provided some excellent entertainment. Unfortunately, the cold weather has deterred Club members from attending in latter months and the future of Social Nights will be a challenge for the incoming committee to resolve.

Major Functions

Our Burns Night and Peter Adams Caledonian Night this year were again very successful thanks to all those who participated. We put out 146 tickets for the Burns Night and over 130 for the Caledonian Night which created a small surplus in both cases. This surplus was used for scholarships and other means of promoting Scottish culture.

This Sunday Soup and Damper lunch was enjoyed in by a good number of members with some hearty soup and extras to sustain us.

Annual St Andrew's Day Service

This annual service held at the Willows Uniting Church, Warner's Bay 25th November 2018 was led by Rev Kenneth Brown. Adam Harvey provided the traditional piping at the church. To complement the service, we all enjoyed morning tea in their church hall and Highland and Scottish Country dancing.

During this term we have produced and distributed ten full newsletters and numerous other posters or memos to keep members informed.

Committee Meetings

Your diligent Committee has faithfully attended and participated in eleven committee meetings (one was washed out by some extremely violent winter weather). At these meeting all our activities were carefully planned and evaluated. As well as the running of our own activities the Committee has spent considerable effort managing Teralba Community Hall.

This year we awarded two Cultural Scholarship - Bodie Chadban and Edward Horner to assist them with the costs of tuition. We look forward to hearing wonderful sounds from this young drummer and young piper.

Points of interest

Why 'Scotland' Yard in England? In 1829 the first organised London Police Force was established in part of old Whitehall Palace. Later the London Police had taken over additional buildings which had housed the Kings of Scotland when they visited the London Court. This was the origin of the name Scotland Yard, which became synonymous with the English Criminal Police.

Those Bonnie Brave Men in Their Tunics. Remember those stirring scenes featuring courageous early 14th century Scots battling the English for their freedom in Braveheart? We knew it was an authentic historical picture because the men are wearing kilts, and what says 'Scotsmen' better than kilts, right? Alas the costume designers forgot to do their research. In truth, Scotsmen didn't begin to wear short kilts (known as 'small' or 'walking' kilts) until nearly 400 years later. (thanks to a 2018 calendar for this information)
